Theater Department at College of DuPage to perform June 28


Wheaton, Ill., June 15, 2022 — Cast members of the Theater Department at College of DuPage will perform an original play at Cantigny Park, under the stars, on Tuesday, June 28, at 6 pm. Admission to family-friendly show is free with paid parking.

“Ocean 9-1-1: Big Blue Rescue” is a mystery that takes place in the town of Oceanside. When a phone line goes dead during a desperate call for help, the Beach Bum Investigative Team must jump into action. Everyone becomes a detective to help the team follow the clues and solve the ocean mystery before it’s too late. Directed by Amber Mitchell, the play is entertaining for all ages.

No tickets are needed for the performance, to be held outside Cantigny’s First Division Museum. Seating is on the lawn, so blankets or chairs are recommended. Picnics are welcome, and food and drink concessions will be available. Parking is \$5 per vehicle.

June 28 is also Cruise Night at Cantigny, a weekly event all summer featuring classic cars, live music, and food trucks. The First Division Museum will stay open until 8 pm.
